

Notice of Race

Euro up (European Championship) 2019 International Sailhorse Class Association

Organized by Sailing Club Workum and the Dutch Sailhorse Sailing Club

May 30th, 31st and June 1st, 2019

Location: Oudegaaster Brekken, Oudega (SWF), the Netherlands

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS 2017/2020)*
- 1.2 The “Rules for Championships Sailing and Windsurfing and Kite boarding” will apply.
- 1.3 No Class Rule changes will apply.
- 1.4 The Europe Cup races can only be properly sailed in a maximum wind force of 6 Bf at the start of a race. In case the wind force, in a race, also in showers, exceeds 7 Bf, the race shall immediately be shortened or abandoned by the Race Officer.
- 1.5 Change of helmsmen, crewmembers or sail numbers may only take place after written approval by the Race Management.
- 1.6 Replacement of a helmsman by a person, who has not been mentioned in the entry, is excluded. Changing a helmsman during a race by a crewmember is no ground for protest.
- 1.7 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.8 Every person on board who has his domicile in the Netherlands shall have the appropriate license.
- 1.9 The online entry form shall be completely filled in for each crew member.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open for boats in the Sailhorse Class.
 - 3.1.1 The touring cup is open for boats equipped for tour sailing.
 - 3.1.2 Rules 1.8, 6.3 and 7 do not apply to the touring class.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form on www.sailhorse.nl.
Entry closing date: May 21th, 2019 at 23:59.

4 ENTRY FEE

- 4.1 The entry fee is: € 40,= per boat.
Payment shall be done by the Dutch competitors by Ideal. Non-Dutch competitors shall pay by transferring the amount to pay (entree fee + options) to Sailhorse Sailing club, INGBNL2A (BIC) NL42INGB0005622451 (IBAN)
- 4.2 Late entries will be accepted under the following conditions: Extra entry fee € 10=.

5 QUALIFYING SERIES AND FINAL SERIES

5.1 None.

6 SCHEDULE

6.1 Registration:

Thursday May 30th, 2019, from 0900 till 11.00 hrs. in the race office. 6.2

Skippers meeting and opening ceremony near the canteen on the campsite

6.3 Measurement and inspection:

After each race, boats scored 1st, 2nd and 3rd may be subject to an equipment inspection.

6.4 Dates of racing:

Thursday May 30th: Racing.

Friday May 31st: Racing.

Saturday June 1st: Racing.

6.5 The Championship will be scheduled for a minimum of five (5) and a maximum of twelve (12) races.

6.6 The scheduled times of the warning signal for the races are:

Thursday May 30th: 12.55 hrs., 3 races back to back.

Friday May 31st: 09.55 hrs., 2 races back to back. After lunch 13.55 hrs., 3 races back to back.

Saturday June 1st: 09.55 hrs., 2 races back to back. After lunch 13.55 hrs., 2 races back to back.

6.7 No warning signal will be given on the Thursday and Friday after 17.00 hrs.

6.8 On the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 16.00 hrs.

6.9 Saturday June 1st:

17.00 hrs.: price giving and closing ceremony.

7 MEASUREMENTS

7.1 Each boat shall produce a valid measurement certificate.

7.2 In addition measurements may be taken as written in par. 6.3 of this NoR.

8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

8.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available after May 1 on www.sailhorse.nl at 12.00 hrs. and will be handed out at registration.

9 VENUE

9.1 The race office is located at the following address: Camping de Bearshoeke, Tsjerkewei 2a, 8614 JD Oudega (SWF)

9.2 Attachment A shows the location of the regatta harbor and the racing area.

9.3 Attachment B shows the oversight of the camping site and your route.

10 THE COURSE

10.1 The courses to be sailed will be noted in the Sailing Instructions.

10.2 The course length will be planned between approximately 50 minutes.

11 PENALTY SYSTEM

11.1 Penalty for breaking RRS rule 55 can be discretionary, as decided by the protest committee. This changes Rule 64.1.

11.2 Penalty for breaking RRS rule 78 can be discretionary, as decided by the protest committee. This changes Rule 64.1.

12 SCORING

12.1 The Low Point System will apply.

12.2 There will be a valid Championship when 5 scoring races have been completed.

- a. When less than 8 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her scores.
- b. When 8 or more of the scheduled races has been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

- c. When 11 or more of the scheduled races has been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her 2 worst scores.

13 SUPPORT BOATS

- 13.1 Support boats shall be marked with a yellow flag.

14 LAUNCHING AND BERTHING

- 14.1 For launching the boats is a slipway available at the entrance of the camping site.
- 14.2 When not sailing, boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the harbor. Instructions by the Harbor Master shall be respected.

15 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

- 15.1 Keel boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

16 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

- 16.1 Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around keel boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

17 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 17.1 Except in an emergency a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 17.2 VHF will only be used for safety communication.

18 PRIZES

- 18.1 Prizes will be given for the first, second and third place in the overall results in the race division and the touring division
- 18.2 The Sailhorse perpetual prize will be handed out to the winning team of the Championship of the racing division.
- 18.3 Each prize will consist of one for the helmsman and one for the crewmember.
- 18.4 The winning team of the Championship will be honored with the title "European Champion in the Sailhorse Class 2019".

19 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 19.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4 RRS, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

20 INSURANCE

- 20.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of Euro 1.000.000 per event or the equivalent.

21 FURTHER INFORMATION

- 21.1 Camping on "the Bearshoeke":
For camping with tent, caravan or camper reserve on the website of the camping. With reservation please type in the Note field "Sailhorse". Further notices for reserving a camping spot:

- Small tents do not have to reserve 220V electric current. Electric current for small tents will be arranged.
- A reasonable small sized tent until 4 persons capacity will be considered a small tent
- Parking of cars on the campsite is not allowed. Cars need to be parked at the parking place. With reservation you have to include your car, the parking is not free.

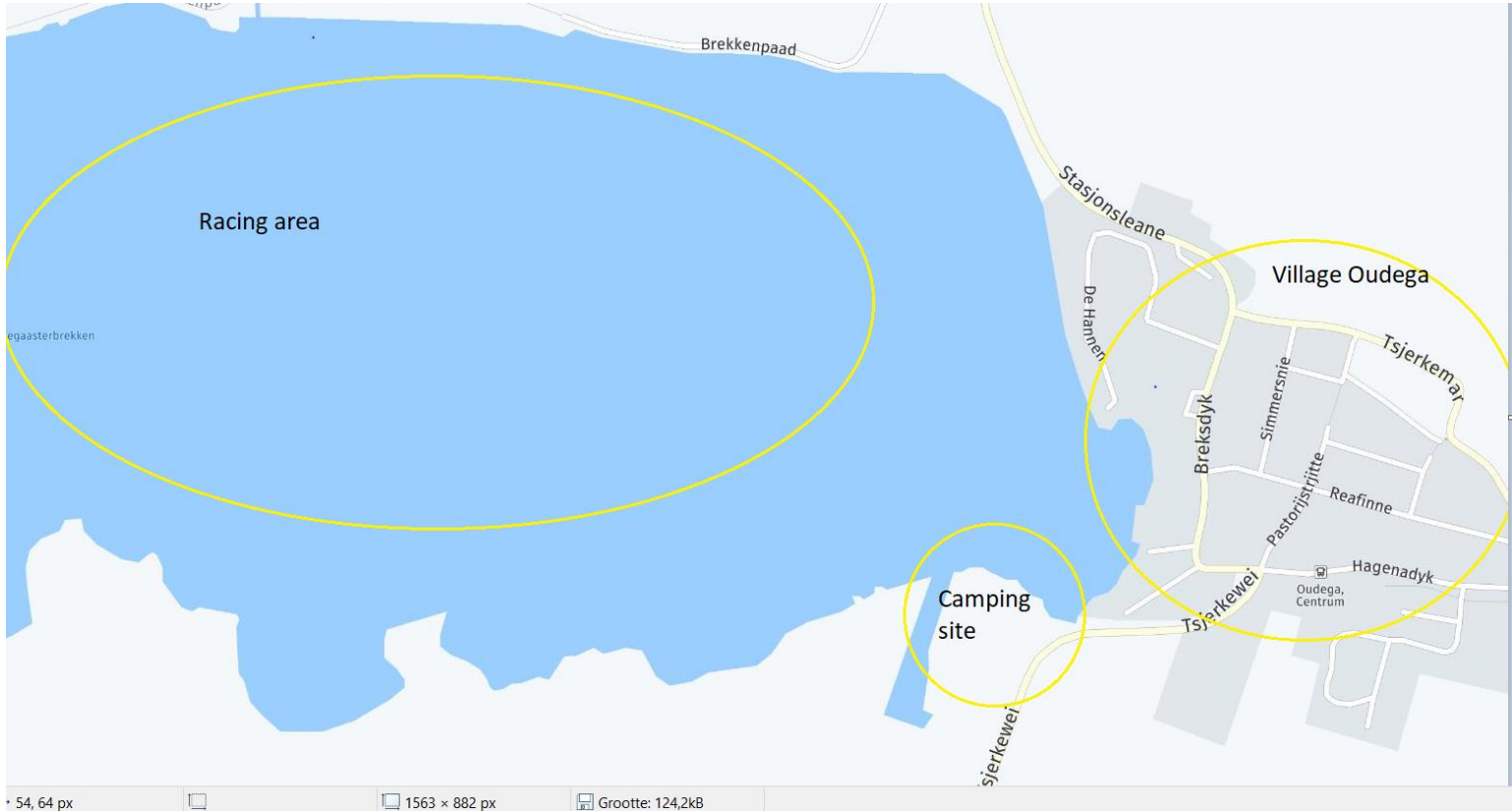
21.2 Sleeping in a wood cabin. Four cabins with each four beds are available. Reserving a bed is only possible for four nights at the price of € 52,- per bed. You reserve a bed in a wooden cabin when you enter your registration for the races. Sailhorse Sailing Club will handle everything with the camp site. You have to bring Your own Tableware and Bedding. 16 beds are available. The 16 first reservations have first rights.

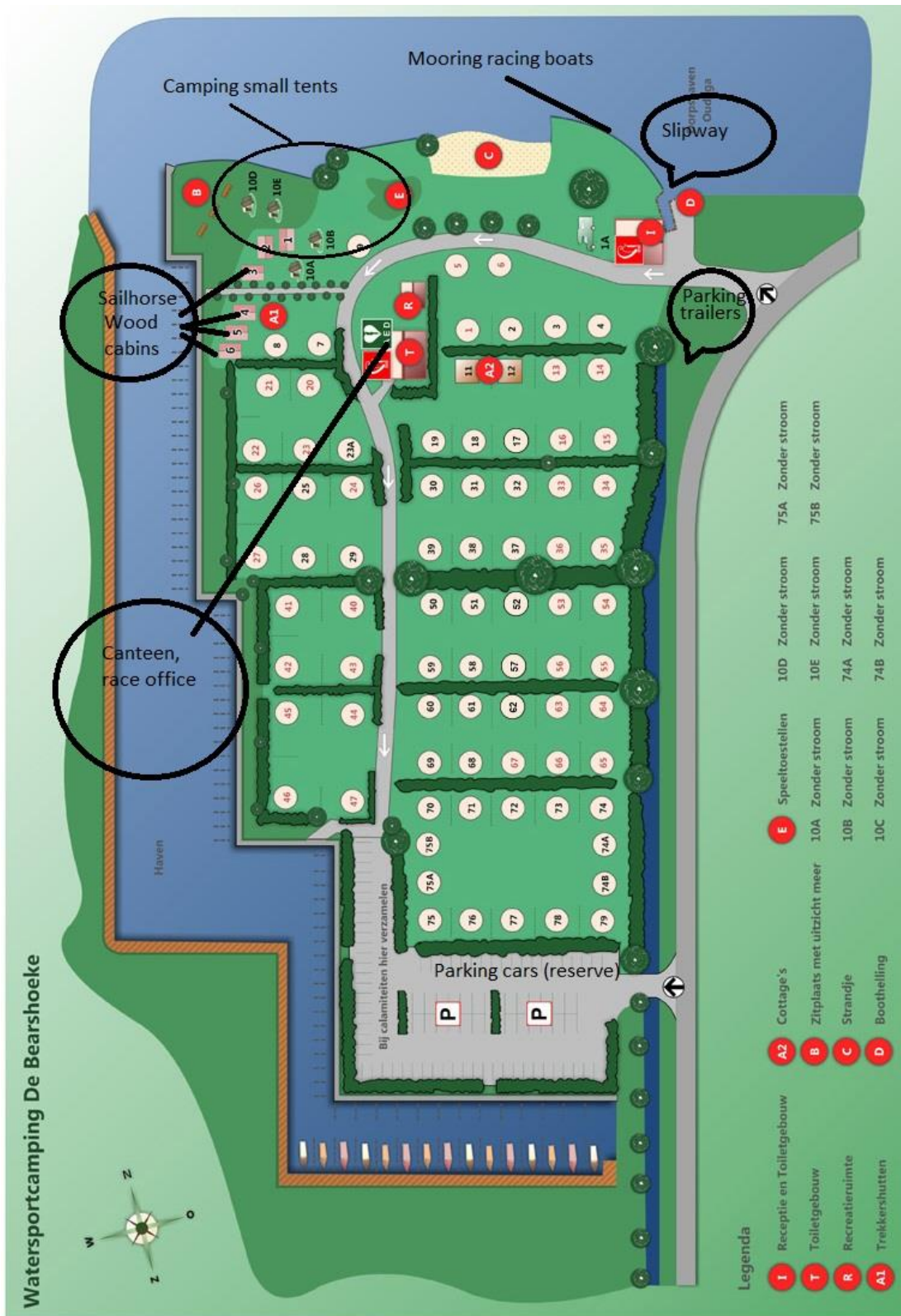
22.1 The racing area.

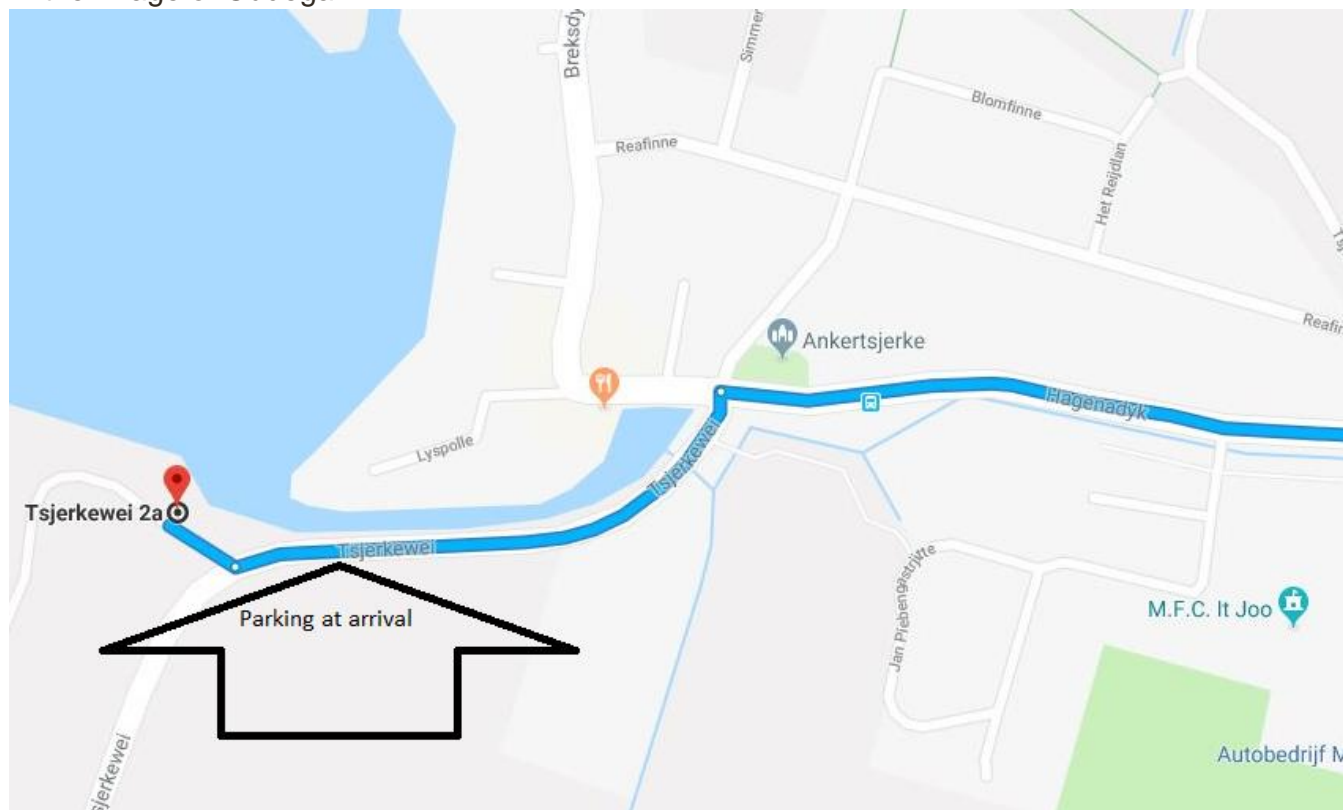
22.4 Your route to Oudega (SWF)

The address of the camping site is:
Tsjerkewei 2a
8614 JD Oudega (SWF)

From traffic junction of highways A32 and A7 (Heerenveen), follow the A7 to Sneek. At Sneek, take the exit to the N354 (Lemmerweg) direction Heeg. At Hommerts, turn right to the Hettingawei direction Heeg. Follow the road all the way to Oudega.

Coming from the south; At the A6 take exit 18 (Oosterzee). Follow the N354. At Hommerts, turn left to the Hettingawei. Follow the road all the way to Oudega.

In the village of Oudega:



Left of the road at arrival is a paved roadside. Please park there at arrival. Do not drive all the way to the entrance of the camping. The slipway is directly at the camping entrance, so want to prevent a traffic jam there. You will be guided to the slipway and camping. Checking in at the camping site is at the reception.

After slipping your boat, park your trailer at the designated place. You can enter the campsite with your car to unload. You cannot park your car near at the tent. After unloading your car and setting up your camp, park your car at the parking place next to the campsite.
